Washington County Trails Master Plan

- This plan identified stakeholder needs for trails and related facilities. A variety of trails are designed (equestrian, hiking, biking, snow-mobile, etc.) as well as a range of typical trail cross-sections (such as separate use trail, shared road trail, multi-use trail, etc.). Planned trail routes are identified along with an implementation strategy.

10th Street Trail, Marion, Iowa

- 4100' x 8' wide trail
- This is a paved multi-use trail connecting to the city trail system leading to downtown Marion and nearby Linn-Mar School. The trail is within the 10th St. right-of-way and adjacent to the Indian Creek and public use area. Traffic calming techniques, enhanced street crossings and attractive plantings were utilized to improve safety, wayfinding and appearance.

Kalona to Richmond Trail, Iowa

- This trail is a three mile multiuse paved trail and is part of and connects with the larger Washington County Trails System. This trail includes both shared roadway and separate use trails, and includes a bridge and scenic river-view overlook.

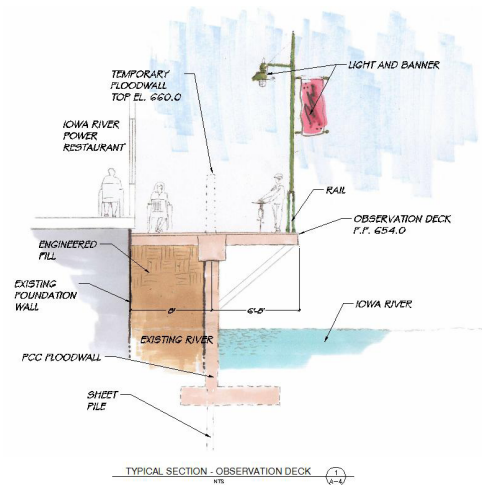
Marr Park Trail, Ainsworth, Iowa to Marr Park

- This separate paved 10' wide multi-use trail provides access to Marr Park from nearby (one mile) Ainsworth. It is located within the U.S. Highway 92 right-of-way to maximize use of existing public property. The signed roadway crossing is located at an existing intersection in Ainsworth to enhance safety.

Iowa River Corridor Trail Extension, Iowa City to Coralville, Iowa

- This one mile multiuse 10' wide paved trail extension provides a separate use trail with a nearly continuous view of the Iowa River. A bridge, rest areas and scenic river overlook areas are included. The most significant feature is the planned trail connection to a scenic overlook at an existing restaurant (located in a former power generating station built in 1902).

Amana Kolonieweg Trail, Amana to Middle Amana, Iowa

- This is a separate 3.1 mile paved multi-use trail connecting the two historic communities of Amana and Middle Amana with the existing trail. Much of the trail is within the Highway 220 right-of-way. Several historic landmarks and the beautiful Amana countryside are visible from the trail.

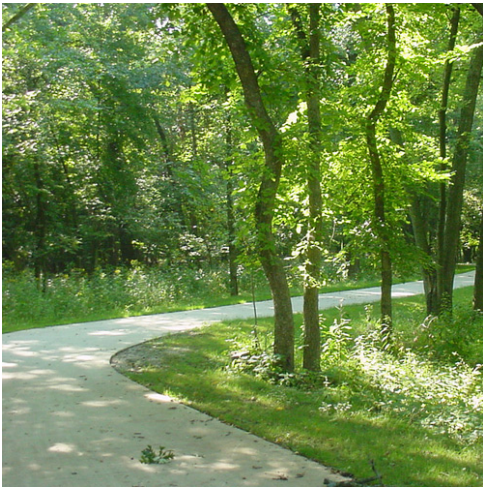
Mississippi River Trail, Riverfront to Weed Park, Muscatine, Iowa

- This separate multi-use paved trail is within the street right-of-way where it starts near the Mississippi River landing. Then the trail traverses up along the bluff to a Victorian style scenic overlook over the Mississippi River.

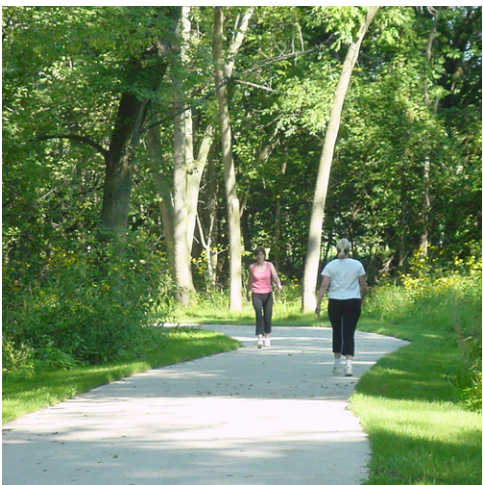
Clear Creek Trail, Phase 2, Coralville, Iowa
